# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

# 1. RULES

- 1.1 The term "boat" in the following rules and instructions also includes windsurfing boards.
- 1.2 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the <u>Racing Rules of sailing 2021-24</u>(RRS), the <u>The Special Regulations of Australian Sailing</u> the NOR for the Hobie class, the class rules of the competing boats and by these sailing instructions.
- 1.3 RRS rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a 360°-Turn Penalty.
- 1.4 Only for windsurfing boards: RRS B3 Touching a mark, B4 42 Propulsion, 43 Drinking Container and 44.2 360°-Turn Penalty apply. No other RRS Appendix B rules apply.

# 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the upper level of the LCSC clubhouse. Changes to Sailing Instructions will be accompanied by a sound Signal and L Flag being flown from the Club mast.

# 3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted at least 1 hour before the first start of the day.

# 5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole on the northern end of the clubhouse.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes'. This changes RRS race signals.

# 6. ORDER OF STARTS AND DIVISION FLAGS

- 6.1 Flags as shown in the table in Attachment A will signal which division is starting.
- 6.2 The race committee may change divisions. This will be advised by Notices to the Competitors and posted on the Club Notice board. Emails to registered competitors may be sent out.

# 7. COURSES

- 7.1 Attachment A shows the courses and how marks must be passed.
- 7.2 The compass bearing of the first leg will be displayed on the start boat no later than the warning signal.

#### 8. ROUNDING MARKS

Marks 1, 2 and 3 will be Yellow inflatable buoys. Mark X, Yp & Ys will be Orange inflatable buoys Mark X1 will be a red/orange Norwegian buoy.

# 9. START

- 9.1 The start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the start boat at the starboard end and a red and white chequered mark at the port end. This buoy may be moved during the race but remains part of the start line while being moved
- 9.2 The start boat is a mark of the course and the buoy attached to the stern of the boat is a part of the boat.
- 9.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other divisions.
- 9.4 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after its starting signal will be scored DNS (did not start) without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1and A5.

# 10. FINISH

The finish line will be the same as the start line, between the Start/finish boat flying a blue flag and a red and white buoy. The buoy may be moved closer to the start boat after all starts are completed. The start/finish line remains an obstruction whilst the buoy is being moved.

# 11. OBSTRUCTIONS

The Start line is an obstruction except when finishing. Boats crossing this line incorrectly will be scored DSQ (disqualified) without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.

# 12. TIME LIMIT

Boats far behind in each division may be 'Finished On-Course' (FOC) at the discretion of the race committee. All boats notified 'FOC' shall return immediately to the start area while avoiding any boats still racing. This changes rules 28.1, 35, and A4.1.

# 13. SAFETY

A boat that retires from the race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

# 14. PROTESTS

- 14.1 Protest forms are available at the office. Protests and requests for redress shall be delivered there within the time limit.
- 14.2 For each division, the time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- 14.3 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 14.4 Hearings will be held in the LCSC office beginning as soon as practical.
- 14.5 Breaches of Starting Instructions, para 3, will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a).
- 14.6 Disqualification, or a lesser penalty (DPI) may be imposed without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1and A5.

# 15. SCORING

- 15.1 Australian Sailing Yardsticks will be used.
- 15.2 The race committee may adjust any boat's handicap.
- 15.3 For the Allboats Regatta 7 races are scheduled, 1 race must be completed to form the regatta, 1 drop after race 5.

# 16. PRIZES

Overall prizes in each Allboats division.

Best sailor under the age of 18.

Best Woman on Water

Best Senior Sailor over 65. (Age must be included in registration.)

Classes of 5 or more boats may be awarded class prizes.

Other prizes may be awarded.

#### 17. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with a third-party insurance with a minimum cover of \$5 million per event.

# 18. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

# SUPPLEMENTARY NOTES

We are part of a small community in Boreen Point and wish to respect the activities of our neighbours.
