#### Rear Commodore's report to General Meeting 21.02.21

The season has progressed well for sailing despite the problems that Covid has presented.

We had a very successful August All Boats regatta with an amazing 100 boats entered. The Cat challenge had 67 entries which is quite reasonable and the Mono Masters 75 entries.

The First Weta nationals were held over Xmas/New Year with 21 boats attending from three states. The Sydney and Victoria folk were tied down with Covid19 but we still had a great regatta which was very much appreciated by the members of the Weta Class association.

Club racing has seen a consistent turn out of up to 20 boats and it seems that there are new boats turning up every week, though that might be due to the Javelin shuffle.

We have two more regattas this year, Easter All boats and the May Day Jack Holt regatta. The Hobies and Javelins will be having their State titles at Easter and it will be interesting to see how many other classes turn up.

All regatta registrations have been done on-line through RevSport and our NORs and SIs have been posted on club web site which seems to have worked very well. I have posted a copy of each regatta SI on the Club Notice Board which seems to help those who have trouble with the internet. The Club Internet will be made available to guests to assist them in registering on-line.

Club racing registrations have also been on-line through the club website but there needs to be a bit more rigour in ensuring that boats are registered before racing starts.

I might also mention that the Learn to Sail is going gangbusters and it is good to see some of the youngsters coming over and competing in the Mono Masters and, I hope, the Easter Allboats.

Our Volunteers have done a fantastic job this year both at regattas and during weekly club racing: we should always be mindful of how much we owe those who give up their time to support the club and let them know how much we appreciate their efforts.

Also a very big thanks to our Race committee who have done a great job during the year. We need viable committees to spread the load around and to give others experience of what is needed to keep the club running.

#### Safety Report for GM on 21.02.21

Neil Patchet and I are carrying out a review of the LCSC Safety Management Plan. The plan was formulated in 2015 and, although there have been some reviews of the risk management controls, the plan is due for a systematic overhaul.

The review of Policy and procedure sections of Safety and Risk management are nearing completion and when these are done we shall move on to reviewing the individual Risk management plans for different activities within the club with due consultation of the stake holders.

It is a vital part of Risk Management that those taking part in operations should identify the risks involved and develop plans to mitigate and control these risks.

Thomas Hilty has proposed that we enter our Defibrillator in the St John's ambulance AED registry and I would recommend that this go ahead. We shall require a contact person for the AED preferably in Boreen Point.

Pads for the AED have passed replacement date and will be changed today.
