NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1. The championships will be governed by the <u>Sailing Instructions</u> and this Notice of Race.
- 1.2. The International Raceboard <u>class rules</u> and the <u>race management policies</u> will apply unless they conflict with rules in 1.1.
- 1.3. The Windsurfing Competition Rules (WCR) and the special regulations of Australian Sailing apply unless they conflict with 1.1. or 1.2.

2. DIVISIONS

- 2.1. A minimum of 5 competitors is required to constitute a division. Divisions may be added or combined at the discretion of the Organising Authority (OA).
- 2.2. Participating fleets:
 - National champion fleet
 - Sprint fleet (sailing a shorter course)
- 2.3. Gender divisions:
 - Women
 - Men
 - Other
- 2.4. Age divisions:
 - Junior born in 2005 or after
 Senior born in 1986 to 2004
 Master born in 1985 to 1976
 Grand Master born in 1975 to 1966
 Veteran born in 1965 to 1961
 Super Veteran born in 1960 or before
- 2.5. Weight divisions:
 - o Light below 70 kg
 - Medium 70 to 85 kg
 - Heavy above 85 kg

3. ENTRIES

- 3.1. Entry is open to all boards of the International Raceboard class.
- 3.2. Competitors shall be financial members of the Australian Windsurfing Association (AWA) or the International Windsurfing Association. All competitors shall comply with World Sailing Eligibility Rules.
- 3.3. Australian competitors shall be financial members of Australian Sailing (AS) and a club affiliated with AS through their relevant state Member National Authority.
- 3.4. Eligible boards may enter online.
- 3.5. Entries close at 24:00 on Tuesday 31 December 2024.
- 3.6. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the OA and upon payment of the late entry fee.

4. FEES

Entry fees, less booking fees, will be refunded if the OA needs to cancel.

5. RACE FORMAT

- 5.1. The regatta shall be a single discipline, course racing, "open entry" event.
- 5.2. All divisions shall race together.

- 6.1. The start times for the second and succeeding races on each day will be as soon as practical after the conclusion of the preceding race.
- 6.2. On Sunday 19 January no warning signal will be made after 15:00.

^{**} Sunday racing is in conjunction with LCSC club racing. Raceboards share the course with club boats but will receive a separate start.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available via the <u>LCSC website</u> prior to the first day of the regatta and during registration.

8. COURSES

Courses will be as described in the Sailing Instructions.

9. SCORING

- 9.1. Scoring will be according to WCR appendix A.
- 9.2. The finishing positions for divisions will be their order in the overall ranking.

10. PRIZES

- 10.1. Medals and/or prizes will be awarded to the first three competitors of each properly constituted class
- 10.2. The following titles shall be bestowed: Australian Raceboard Champion (male and female).
- 10.3. Other awards may be made at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

11. MEASUREMENT

- 11.1. Raceboard class rules for measurement will apply.
- 11.2. Equipment shall only be replaced with the written permission of the Race Committee in consultation with the class measurer. An Equipment Substitution Form (available at the Regatta Office) must be submitted.

12. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The Organising Authority (OA) will be the Lake Cootharaba Sailing Club (LCSC) in conjunction with the Australian Windsurfing Association.

13. ADVERTISEMENT

All advertising will be in accordance with World Sailing Regulation.

14. SUPPORT BOATS

- 14.1. If called upon, support boats will be required to act as rescue boats. Support boats shall register with the OA.
- 14.2. Coaches supporting athletes at the championship shall register with the OA prior to the commencement of racing.
- 14.3. Support and coach boats are required to have a VHF radio with the capability of using VHF channel 77.

15. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a competitor shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all competitors. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

16. INSURANCE

- 16.1. Each competitor shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10 million per event or equivalent. Members of AWA through their respective state class association automatically have their coverage.
- 16.2. AWA Membership of competitors will be checked at registration.

17. DISCLAIMER

It is the competitor's sole decision to enter this event and to start and/or to continue to compete. By way of entering, competitors acknowledge and agree that participation in this event can be dangerous and accept that their participation is at their exclusive risk in every respect. In addition, by way of entering competitors shall hold harmless the organising authority, its officers, members, servants and agents and all other competitors in respect of all liability for injury to their person and or loss or damage to their property howsoever arising from their participation or intended participation in this event and acknowledge and accept that the organising authority, its officers, members, servants, agents and other competitors accept no responsibility in respect to loss of life, personal injury or loss or damage to property which may be sustained by reason of a competitor's participation or intended participation in this event or arising for whatever reason in connection with this event.

18. RIGHTS

- 18.1. By participating in the Championship competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority, the Class Associations and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of competition without compensation.
- 18.2. Support boats and competitors may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organising Authority.
- 18.3. Competitors may be required for interviews and press conferences at the Championship.

19. ACCOMMODATION
