



Mono Masters Regatta **6th & 7th December 2025** **Including MG state titles**



NOTICE OF RACE

1. INVITATION

- 1.1. Lake Cootharaba Sailing Club (LCSC) invites entries to the 2025 Mono Masters Regatta. The MG State Titles are being run in conjunction with this event.
- 1.2. The regatta is open to all classes of off the beach monohulls, sailboards, trailer sailers and Weta trimarans.

2. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

- 2.1. The Organizing Authority (OA) for this event is the Lake Cootharaba Sailing Club Inc. (ABN 30 624 557 096)

3. DIVISIONS

- 3.1. The fleet will be divided into 5 divisions as follows:
 - Division 1 - MG
 - Division 2 - Monohulls YS less than 110,
 - Division 3 – Monohulls YS equal to or greater than 110.
 - Division 4 - Weta 1-up and 2-up
 - Division 5 – Juniors (Optis, Open Skiffs, etc.)
- 3.2. Where multiple classes are included in the same division, places will be determined using Australian Sailing Yardsticks (YS) or using the current CBH adjusted by the conversion formula to YS for trailer sailers.
- 3.3. For trailer sailers, full boat details/modifications should be entered at the time of registration to enable correct and equitable handicapping.
- 3.4. The Race Committee may change or add to the divisions and/or combine starts depending on the number of entries.



4. ENTRIES

- 4.1. Registration is only available online at the LCSC website or by using the following link <https://www.revolutionise.com.au/lcsc/events/322563>.
- 4.2. To assist with the organisation of the event, it is requested that all registrations and payments be completed by 5pm, Thursday 4th December 2025. Although entries will be accepted after this time, a late entry fee will apply.

5. FEES

- 5.1. Competitors 18 years of age and older as at 1 December 2025: \$95 (LCSC members: \$85).
- 5.2. Competitors under the age of 18 years as at 1 December 2025: \$60 (LCSC members: \$50).
- 5.3. Entry fees include a free sausage sizzle for competitors on the Saturday evening.

6. SCHEDULE

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.2. The sailing instructions will include details of how competitors will be notified of any changes to those instructions.



8. COURSES

8.1. Triangular and windward/leeward courses may be used. Details of the courses will be included in the sailing instructions.

9. PRIZES

9.1. The following prizes will be awarded:

- Overall placegetters in each division.
- Best junior skipper.
- Best female competitor
- Best competitor over 65 (age must be included in registration)

9.2. Other prizes may be awarded depending on entry numbers.

10. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

10.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Racing Rule 3, Decision to Race.

10.2. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

11. TELEVISION AND PHOTOGRAPHER'S RIGHTS

11.1. Competitors give permission for video footage or photographs of themselves or their boat to be published in any media for press, editorial or advertising purposes.

12. INSURANCE

12.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party personal and property liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10 million per event or the equivalent thereof. By entering the regatta, each competitor declares that they have the required insurance cover. The OA will not be liable if a competitor falsely declares that they have insurance.

- 14.6. A kiosk selling coffee and snacks is located below the clubhouse and will be open during the event. Lunches can be pre-ordered.
- 14.7. The Apollonian Hotel provides excellent pub food.
- 14.8. There are no convenience stores in Boreen Point. The nearest shops are at Tewantin and Pomona (both around 20 minutes' drive away). Tewantin has a reasonably sized Woolies that is open until 8:00pm each evening (94 Poinciana Ave, Tewantin, QLD 4565). There is also a small boating store at Tewantin (<https://noosaboatman.com.au/>).

15. TRAILER PARKING, SPEED LIMITS AND RESPECT FOR THE COMMUNITY

- 15.1. The speed limit on the roads leading to the club and along the foreshore is 20kph and it is important for the safety of pedestrians that this is adhered to. A 40kph speed limit applies to most other roads in Boreen Point.
- 15.2. Although parking is available adjacent to the beach at Boreen Point, all competitors are asked to off-load their boats and then take their road trailers back to their accommodation. If this is not possible, the club's storage compound will be open, and competitors are asked to take their trailers there. The compound is around 300 metres away from the beach and volunteers will be on hand to provide directions.
- 15.3. Competitors are also reminded that Boreen Point is a quiet community, and we share the beach and the surrounding areas with local residents. Every effort should be made to respect the rights of others to enjoy the area as much as we do. Please do not park in front of residents' garages and driveways even if it looks like no one is home.
